University of California

- 74% of students who applied were admitted to a UC campus while 75% of those admitted chose to enroll at a UC campus in 2011-12.

- Transfers to UC campuses increased 21% from 2009-10 to 2011-12 and increased 15% between 2010-11 and 2011-12.
- The highest number of transfers in 2011-12 was to Davis (24% of all transfers), San Diego (23%) and Berkeley (19%).

- Transfers to CSU campuses increased 59% from 2009-10 to 2011-12, however, transfers between 2010-11 and 2011-12 decreased by 5%. The large increase in transfers between 2009-10 and 2011-12 is attributable to open spring admissions at CSU campuses in 2011 after admissions were closed in spring 2010.
- The highest number of transfers in 2011-12 were to San Jose (62% of all transfers), San Francisco (16%) and East Bay (9%).

- Asian students transfer at the highest rate, over 32% of all transfers, followed by White students, over 21% of all transfers, then Latino students making up over 12% of all transfers.
- Transfers by ethnicity increased for all ethnic groups between 2009-10 and 2011-12.
- Students in our targeted groups, which include African Americans, Latinos, and Filipinos, who transferred to CSU campuses doubled between 2009-10 and 2011-12.
- Between 2010-11 and 2011-12 overall transfers decreased by 5% which resulted in a decrease in transfers for African American, Asian, Other/Unknown and White students, but Filipino and Latino students increased in the number of transfers to CSU campuses in this time period.

Notes:

UC full-year transfers for 2009-10 to 2011-12 were provided by the UC Office of the President.

CSU full-year transfers for 2009-10 to 2011-12 were provided by the CSU Analytics Office.

Transfers by ethnicity were not provided by UC and applicants, admits and enrollees were not provided by CSU.

Transfers to Private and Out-Of-State Institutions have not been updated by the Community College Chancellor’s Office since 2009-10.
